INTRODUCTION

Know how to adapt!

It also means being connected with members of a community, and members of the host community, public assistance services and state institutions.

Knowledge of the social, economic, and normative environment in which you live will help you understand codes of conduct and good manners

It is fundamental in the assessment of your new situation and the ability to adapt with an open mind to different contexts / environments.

Understanding the formal and informal operating rules of the host country is an essential factor in participating like any citizen in the social life of the host country.

Acquiring the important notions of citizenship and the organization of work in France improves our interactions and our self-confidence, like the issue of gender equality for example.

This will give you the ability to recognize the opportunities that come your way, to defend yourself, but also to prepare you to overcome prejudices.

Knowing how to recognize the social and cultural values of the host country is a tremendous personal asset for better adapting to the societal contexts of the host country.

In this WebQuest, we will discover together how to be in perfect connection with the host community.

TASKS

Your town hall prepares local events and is looking for volunteers to help organize debates around the French Republic. The social services in connection with the town hall wish to associate migrant women with the various activities in preparation.

You must therefore find out about the July 14 holiday and the values that constitute French society.

In the first part, you will develop basic knowledge by studying some French social and cultural values that you absolutely must know.





In the second part, you will discuss your ability to adapt to the social and normative context in France.

In the third part, you will analyze how this knowledge will be useful to you in a work context, to recognize the opportunities that come your way, to defend yourself and to value yourself.

In the fourth part, you will write an introductory speech presenting the social, economic and normative environment in France.

PROCESS

STEP 1: Knowledge on French cultural values

Using a search engine, you will search for 3 examples of social and cultural values representing France as the "land of lights". Please give us at least one example.

STEP 2 : Knowing how to adapt to the social and normative context in France

What are the codes of conduct and good manners, the social rules and the laws to know or understand in order to live in France? Please give at least 2 examples for each category.

Do not forget that you are trying to acquire here the knowledge of French sociocultural life to allow you to adapt and participate in the civic life of the Country.

Do not forget that you will be required to present, to speak about these values in front of different interlocutors and to question your understanding of these values.

STEP 3: Do you really know gender equality and how can this knowledge help you in your daily life, in a group and in a working environment?



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You will think about and write down examples of situations in which you might find this useful:

Remember that you are trying to understand the formal and informal operating rules of the host country, its culture so that you can adapt and participate in the civic and economic life of the country.

You learn to recognize opportunities and to defend and defend your rights professionally. Remember that you will be required to present and talk about these rights in front of different interlocutors and to explain your understanding of these values.

STEP 4: Writing a motivation letter

Now that you have gathered all this information, this knowledge, you will write an introductory speech presenting the social, economic and normative environment in France.


